Nob Hill Water was awarded two construction lowinterest loans through the Department of Health's Drinking Water State Revolving Fund for the 2025 cycle.

One loan will be used to update and repair the two Westbrook Reservoirs, located at 80th and Poplarview Way. These updates will extend the life of the reservoirs approximately 30 years.

The second loan will be for equipping the Barrett Well, located at Barrett Road, just west of Mize. Additionally, the Association was awarded \$500,000 from Yakima County's ARPA funding.



2024 Infrastructure Fee

Nob Hill Water Board Members adopted a new Infrastructure Fee of \$17 per billing cycle that was implemented in 2022 to fund the replacement of aging infrastructure. During the third year, 2024, Nob Hill Water collected **\$1,388,024.50 from customers**. Below is a compilation of how these funds were used throughout the system.
